Connecting with Jesus, making Him known November 2019

"Remember, Remember the 5th of November, Gunpowder Treason and Plot...." I love the sound of fireworks and the amazing colours that light up the sky at this time of year, but let's look at the history of all of this for a moment. The gunpowder plot saw a group of disaffected Roman Catholics conspire to assassinate the Protestant King James 1st by blowing up the House of Lords with matches, fuses and 36 barrels of gunpowder in 1605. The plan was foiled at the last minute – an event celebrated annually in Britain on the 5th November. Sadly, battles have been fought on many occasions in the supposed promotion of faith by different religious groups.

One of the things I really love about the church of Christ the Servant King (CSK) is that we are a family of Christians of many different denominations: Anglicans. Roman Catholics, Baptists, Pentecostals, Salvation Army, Free Church, and others. This is what is written in the book of Galatians in the Bible: "In Christ's family there can be no division into Jew and non-Jew, slave and free, male and female. Among us you are all equal. That is, we are all in a common relationship with Jesus Christ." (*The Message translation*)

We sometimes begin our time together in CSK on a Sunday morning at 10am sharing these words: "Spirit of unity, reconciling God, We have come on journeys of our own, to a place where journeys meet." We endeavour to treat everyone equally at CSK: God loves us all. If this is your first visit, your 1000th visit, or if you haven't yet joined us on a Sunday morning, know that you would be made very welcome.

The flags enable us to express the sung words through movement as we give God the honour & proclaim his presence with us.

Sunday Groups

We are all in a group! Whatever age we are, there's a group at CSK for you. So you may have seen a subtle change to our Sunday morning slide. Our church family is a family of all ages and God wants to be in relationship with each one of us, whatever age we are. It's important that we can worship together as a family and that is how we always begin our 10am Morning Worship - together. However, it is also good to spend time with those who are of a similar age. During Sunday morning worship there comes a time when we split into groups with some people remaining in the Main Worship Space while others go off to different parts of the building. In all there are 6 different areas being used - Upstairs (CSK Youth - secondary age); Creche Area (Under 3s with their parent/carer); Main Worship Space (Adults and some under 3s); Quiet Room (Glow - age 3 years -Reception); Back Hall (Year 1 - Year 3) and The Portacabin (Illumin8 Year 4 - Year 6). So whichever group you are in, be ready and open for what God might want to say to you.

we will be inviting the Reception children from our local Hampton Primary Schools to come on a Christmas Journey; there will be a Christmas Crafts afternoon (Sunday 15th December, 3 - 5pm.
